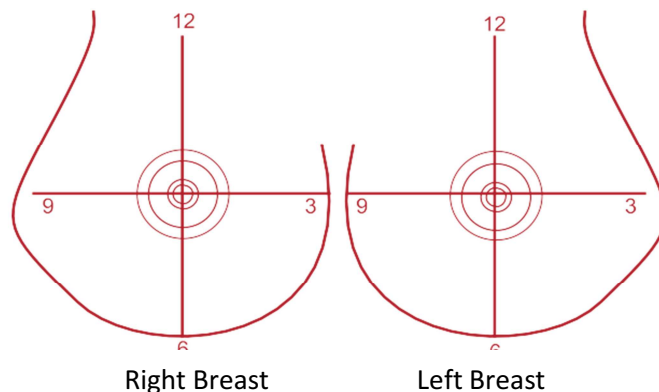

What you should know:

- Deodorant, perfume, powders, or ointments applied to the breast or under the arms before the test may make a mammogram difficult to interpret.
- Breast implants or scar tissue from previous breast surgery may make a mammogram difficult to interpret.

Tell your health professional:

- If you are or might be pregnant. A mammogram is an x-ray test with exposure to low-dose radiation.
- If you are breast-feeding. A mammogram may not provide clear results in breast that contain milk.
- If you have breast implants. Breast implants requires a modified mammogram method.
- If you have previously had a breast biopsy. Knowing the location of scar tissue will help the radiologist read your mammogram accurately.
